6. PUBLIC AND ADMINISTRATIVE PRESENTATIONS

6.1 Public Transportation by the Chaleur Regional Service Commission

The Chaleur Regional Service Commission (CRSC) has been assigned the mandate for public transportation in the region. The Transportation Coordinator Jessica Poirier provides an overview of the CRSC's public transportation three-year pilot project.

1. Project Overview

• **Objective:** Initiate a Phase 1 pilot project for a public bus service.

• Key Actions:

- Purchase three 20-seater commercial minibuses
- Launch service in Bathurst
- o Phase 2 to focus on regional expansion

2. Implementation Committee

- Members will include:
 - Municipal administration
 - Police services
 - Fire services
 - Public works
 - Other relevant stakeholders

3. Service Itinerary and Stops

• Route Design: Fixed line connecting residential areas to key travel points such as:

- o CCNB
- Hospital
- Grocery stores and pharmacies
- Medical clinics and government services

• Bus Stop Features:

- O Accessible within a 5-10 minute walk from served areas
- Stops near intersections and points of interest
- O Spacing: 300-500 meters, maximum 1 kilometer

4. Signage and Accessibility

- Clear signage for embarkation/disembarkation points
- Bus shelters at high-traffic stops
- 5. Proposed Service Scenario
- Operating six days a week for 12 hours daily
- 6. **Pricing Structure**
- **Fare:** \$3.50 per trip
- Discounted multi-purchase cards to promote accessibility
- 7. Logistics and Team Structure
- Managed by the CRSC with community and public transport coordination
- Staffing includes:
 - o Manager
 - Dispatcher
 - Full-time and part-time drivers
- Start Date: Fall 2025, contingent on equipment supply
- 8. Financial Overview
- Revenue and Expenses:
 - o Total revenues for 2025: \$325,335
 - o Expenses for 2025: \$407,708
 - Municipal contribution for 2025: \$82,373 (Breakdown: \$17,674 for community transportation, \$64,699 for bus services)
- Federal and provincial funding:
 - o Federal program: 80%

- o RDC: 10%
- Other community members to reimburse Bathurst for the remaining 10% asset cost upon joining
